Objective:

Details of the Event:

Debate Topics:

First Round (13th - 16th January):

1. Artificial Intelligence and Employment
Will artificial intelligence replace human jobs, or will it only transform the workforce?
2. Legalization of Narcotics
Do economic benefits outweigh public safety concerns?

Second Round (17th January)

1. Clinical Research in Economically Poor Countries
Is it ethical to conduct clinical trials in low-income countries?
2. Patient Protection in India
Are existing healthcare laws in India sufficient to protect patient rights and safety?

Third Round (19th January)

1. Indian Patent Laws:
Are India's patent laws adequate to protect indigenous designs and traditional innovations?

Final Round (02nd February)

1. Literature as a lens for scientific ethics:
Do fictional literature like Frankenstein and The Citadel highlight ethical responsibilities in science, medicine and policies involving the same



